SICKBAY

“If I Only Had a Brain (that worked half the time)”

I know that the title is misleading because this month's article is intended to be serious.

Although the human brain is one of the most important parts of the body, it absolutely is the most complex and fascinating organ in the human body. The brain controls all of the body's functions, even while we are asleep. Just like a torn muscle or a scratched finger, the brain is subject to illness too.

Ashley, my daughter, has a slight case of epilepsy. She is on the most common medication for seizures, Phenobarbital. This past July 2nd, we drove to St. Francis Hospital to allow her to be scanned for any abnormal brain functions. This process is known more commonly as an electroencephalogram, or EEG. The brain and heart are connected to a machine (in this case a computer) and the EEG measures and records the brain activities and heart function. The doctor takes these readings and analyzes them for abnormalities. When Ashley suffered her first seizure in 1997, the doctor took these EEG readings and decided to put her on the medication as a precaution. We are still awaiting the results of the most recent EEG so we will know if she can discontinue the Phenobarbital. I will let you know the results the next time.

The point is, although the brain is protected by the hard shell known as the skull, it is still prone to injury. The best way to protect your brain is to always wear a helmet when riding in any vehicle not covered with a sturdy metal roof, such as a bike or motorcycle. Also, when swimming, do not dive into unfamiliar water headfirst. This will save you a lifetime of misery. Follow these tips and I assure you will....."Live long and prosper!"
