FROM THE CENTER SEAT

This month the USS DaVinci will reach a milestone not all Starfleet Chapters reach. On 16 March, we will be celebrating our 15th anniversary as a Starfleet Chapter! Wow! Where has the time gone? I still remember the day in February of 1995 when, shortly after moving back to Columbus from Killeen, TX, I made inquiries into starting a Starfleet chapter in Columbus. Soon after, the Shuttle DaVinci was born. The 15 July, 1995 Vessel Registration Request (VRR) for Shuttle status contained the following seven names:

Although the USS DaVinci was my first choice for a name, there were two other names on the request sent to the Starfleet Office of Vehicle Registry. My second choice was the USS Magellan and my third choice was the USS Amelia Earhart. At first I was going to have the DaVinci be a Galaxy Class starship but when Voyager premiered, I loved the design of the Intrepid Class starship and went in that direction instead.

Following our official launch, the Shuttle DaVinci went hard to work attracting more Starfleet members to her ranks. We needed 10 Starfleet members to be eligible for full chapter status. By the time we were commissioned (along with the USS Okatoma) at the first Region 2 Sunny Summit, we had 18 Starfleet members on board. Of the original 18 members,

only 4 are still part of the USS DaVinci – Connie, Travis, Joe, and myself. Here are a few photos of those early days!

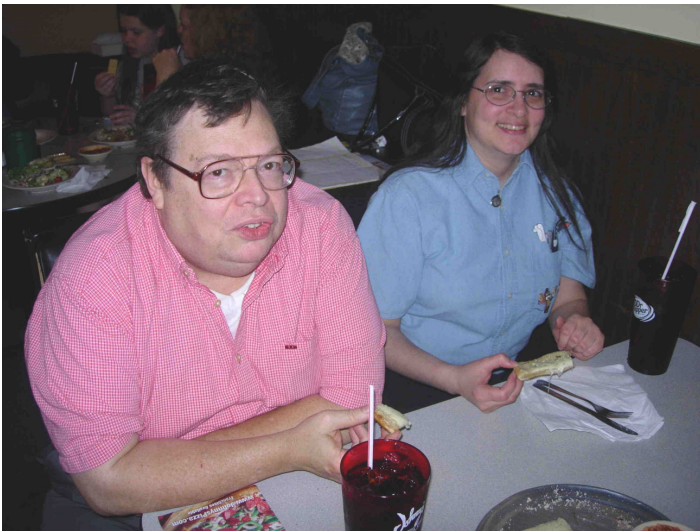

GAME MASTER

This month, I will be continuing my discussion of professions. We will be discussing the secondary professions. There are now four secondary professions and you can train in all of them.

The first secondary profession is First Aid. There are two recipes for Anto-Toxins, but the bulk of First Aid is the making of various bandages. A toon with the requisite skill level can use bandages to heal either their own toon or another toon. The amount healed varies by the cloth used to make the bandage. While killing humanoid mobs, they will be dropping cloth that can be used by this profession. Any class can use this profession in order to limit the downtime between killing mobs.

The next profession is Cooking. Cooking takes meat that drops from beast mobs and can be turned food. This food can be used as pet food or in later levels can provide buffs to the toon. Many foods have minimum level requirements and any toon, which meets the requirements, can use the food and receive the buff whether they have cooking as a profession.

This is closely followed by Fishing. Fishing requires a fishing pole. The fish that is provided can be used in cooking to provide additional benefits.

Fishing is commonly used as a time filler, There is not enough time before something happens, so rather than not doing anything, you go fishing.

The last profession is also the newest. It was added in the last expansion but does not require the expansion. This profession is Archaeology. With this profession, you will have 4 dig sites on each continent. You go to the dig site and use your shovel to find artifact fragments. When you first find artifact fragments of a given race, you will be assigned a random project. Each will require you to find a number of fragments and when you have acquired at least that number, you can solve the project and obtain an artifact. You will be assigned a new project for that race. This profession is the ultimate time-killer, each fragment find only takes a small amount of time, and so you can do them as many times as you can.

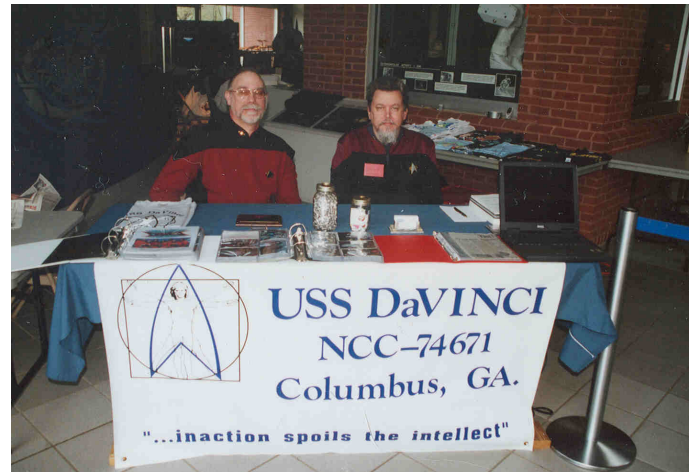

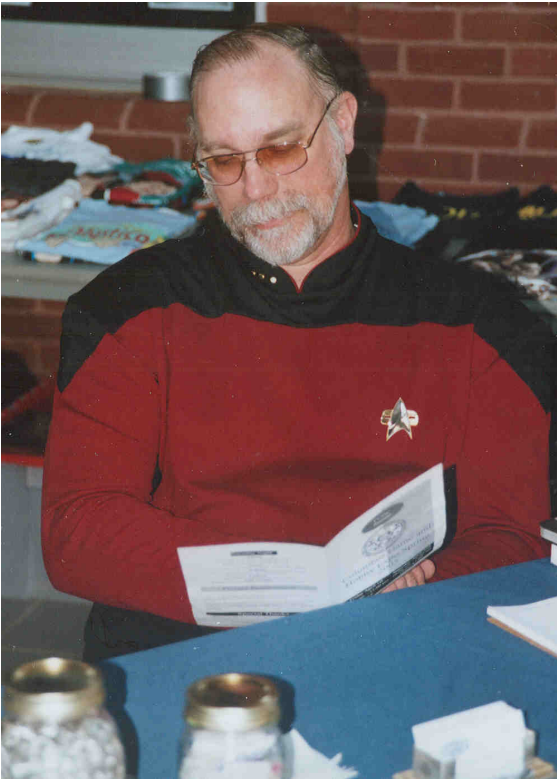
