

Meeting up with friends, new and old, is how IC 2025 – Space City Houston started. While the people on the Executive Committee and Admiralty Board got to work early on Friday morning the rest of us were able to greet each other as we either walked through the front doors or came down from our rooms. Around 3:00 PM Registration opened, and the silent auction kicked off. From 10:15 to 11:00 there was the Klingon Customs and Culture presentation, presided over by members of the IKV Logh

Houston's very own Klingon Veng, delegation. Around 12:15 those of the attendees that had tickets for the Space Center Houston and NASA Tour were taken to the center where we had lunch and met our tour guides. Touring the Space Center Houston is generally self-guided but the USS Zavala was able to enlist 3 very gracious NASA professionals to lead our group in tours. (1) Phyllis Friello, the Project Science Lead for the Exploration Medical Integrated Product Team at Johnson Space Center. 2) Will Green, who is an EHP Cross Program Integrator working in NASA's program providing the EVA and human surface capabilities. 3) mobility Dr. David Alexander, Flight Surgeon, the Principal Medical Officer for the Moon to Mars: Gateway program.) While at the Space Center we toured the Space Shuttle Independence which was sitting on the 747 that was used to transport the space shuttles. After returning from the Space Center the Final Mission was held in the Atrium in front of the Atlantis Ballroom. I am partial to this event. It is a touching way to honor those who are no longer with us. Once the Final Mission was completed, we attended the Admiral's Banquet. After the meal, there was an interesting presentation by a member of a local space debris clean up company. Before turning everyone loose for the dance floor and the open bar upstairs, several awards and promotions were handed out. Not the least of which was our very own First Officer Mike Watkins being promoted from Captain to Fleet Captain. Congratulations, Mike.

Sunday began at 9:00 AM with Ask the Brass, where questions, both in person and via Zoom, were answered. At 10:00 AM the Meet the Candidates event was held. As it

turns out this year's vote is a Vote of Confidence instead of an election. Please remember that it is just as important to vote in a Vote of Confidence as it is in an election. By not voting you are turning over your electoral authority to someone else. Please, anyone who has the capability to vote, whether yes or no, make your "voice" heard. Between 11:15 and 12 the Closing Session was held, where it was announced that the Silent Auction had made approximately \$2500 to give to charity. The first \$500 going to the fleet's charity The Planetary Society (founded by Carl Sagan, Bruce Murray, and Louis Friedman) and the rest going to SFI's

scholarship fund. This year's IC was officially closed, and pictures were taken. Many sad goodbyes were said, but as with most everything there is a silver lining - we will get to say hello to our new friends again next time.

Putting a very special bow on this IC was the fact that I got to visit with the DaVinci's founder, Freddy and his wife Connie. It was great seeing you two again. We miss you.






